ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC MEETING

The 2nd Annual Scientific Meeting of AHAD-AP was held virtually in collaboration with IAHAD on September 16 & 17, 2022.

The scientific program committee worked with colleagues from different countries in the region to put together a program which included recent global advances in the field as well as subjects of particular relevance to haemophilia practice in our region. Given the special need for enhanced diagnostic efforts and management of musculoskeletal complications of this disease, two special meeting tracks were included in the program to cover these subjects.

The 2-day meeting covered the following key topics - Global pricing and access to Emicizumab and EHLs, Adaptation of the WFH guidelines 2020, Early Prophylaxis in Haemophilia, Anamnesis and many more.

Sessions held in the Nurses stream, MSK stream and Laboratory stream were the highlights of the program with 03 scientific sponsored symposia organised by the industry.

There were 825+ registrations received in total and the conference received excellent feedback and a few suggestions from the participants, which will help in better planning of the next AHAD-AP conferences and meetings.

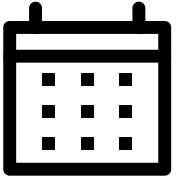

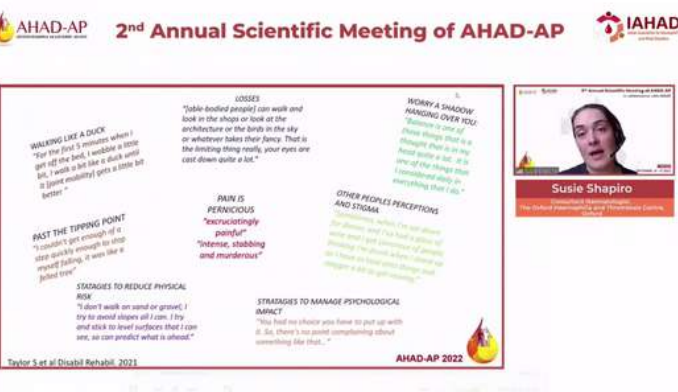

This workshop was held on 12 and 19 March 2022, on a virtual platform. This will be followed by an advanced set of CCH workshop in 2023.

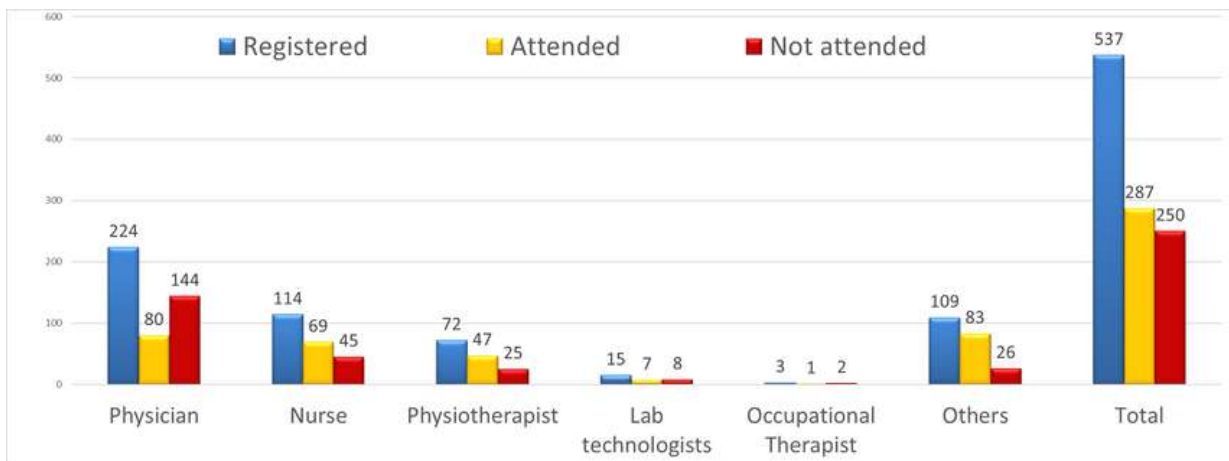


Fig 1: Registration and Attendance- Basic CCH workshop 2022

AHAD-AP will continue to work towards its objective of enhancing haemophilia care through the various educational and training activities.

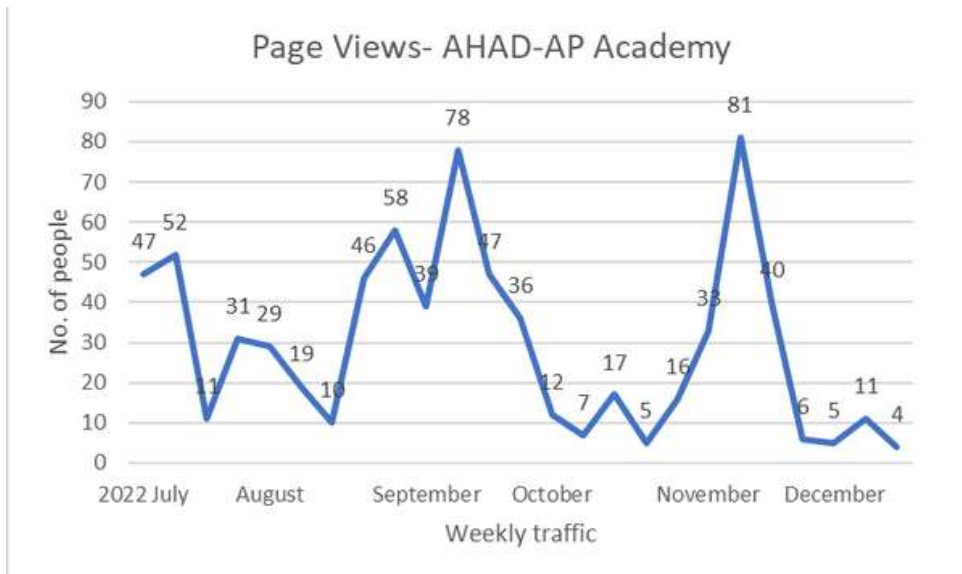


Fig 2: Page views on the Academy platform from June-Dec 2022

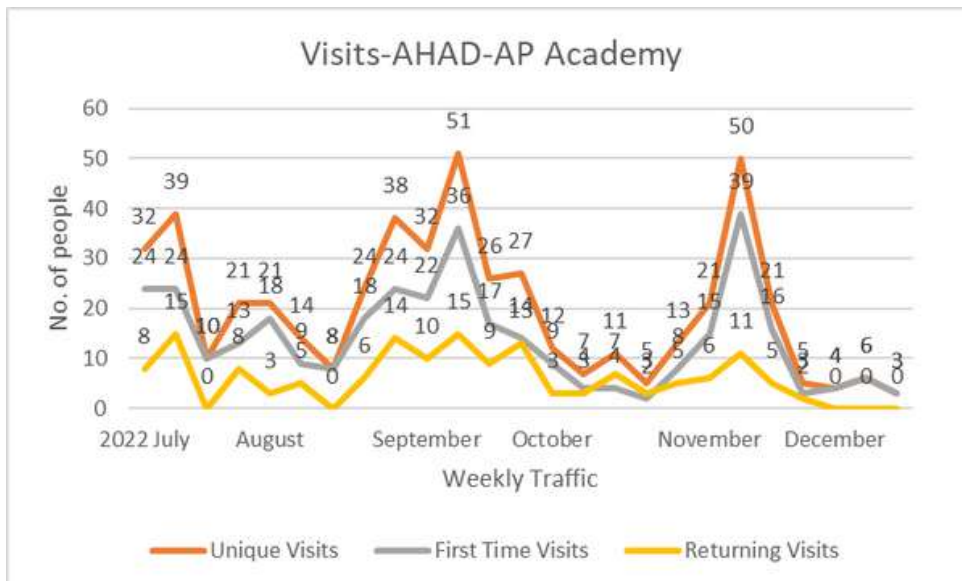


Fig 3: Visits of the Academy platform from June-Dec 2022

The Functional currency of AHAD-AP as determined under FRS 21 is USD (United States Dollar). The financial statement is presented in USD.

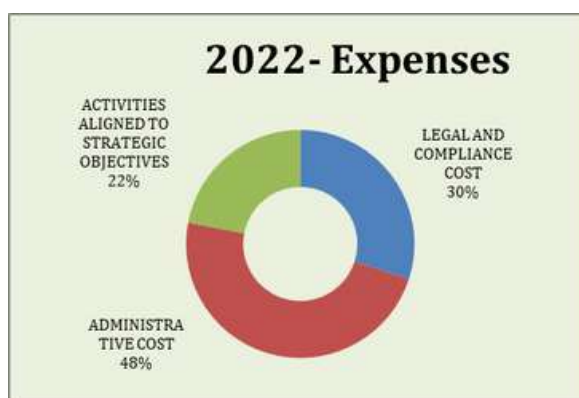
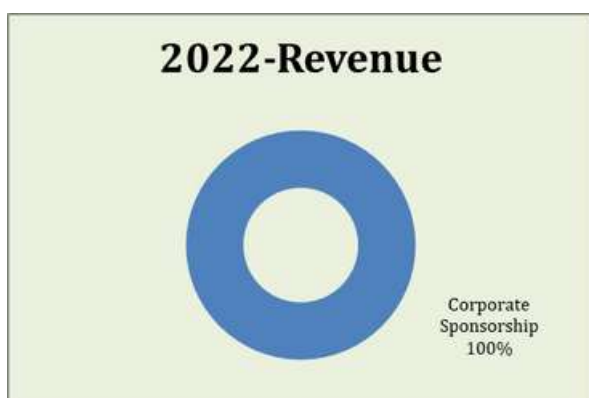
All funds generated from operations prior to incorporation of AHAD-AP in July 2020 were managed by the World Federation of Hemophilia (WFH) under an MOU. By September 2021, AHAD-AP opened an independent account and the funds from WFH were transferred to AHAD-AP.

For the Financial Year 2021-2022, there was a net deficit of USD 10,087. The activities & operations of Association for Haemophilia and Allied Disorders-Asia Pacific (AHAD-AP) are supported by grants received from sponsors. While AHAD-AP experienced net deficits for the Financial Years 2021-22, it's important to note that we had accumulated surplus from the previous years which were used to fund the operations and activities during this period. Such accumulated surpluses were generated since 2014 through the erstwhile Asia Pacific Haemophilia Working Group (APHWG).

Revenue and Expenses

Revenue of AHAD-AP for the financial Year 2022 was in the form of grants received from corporate sponsors towards supporting overall operational costs of the company.

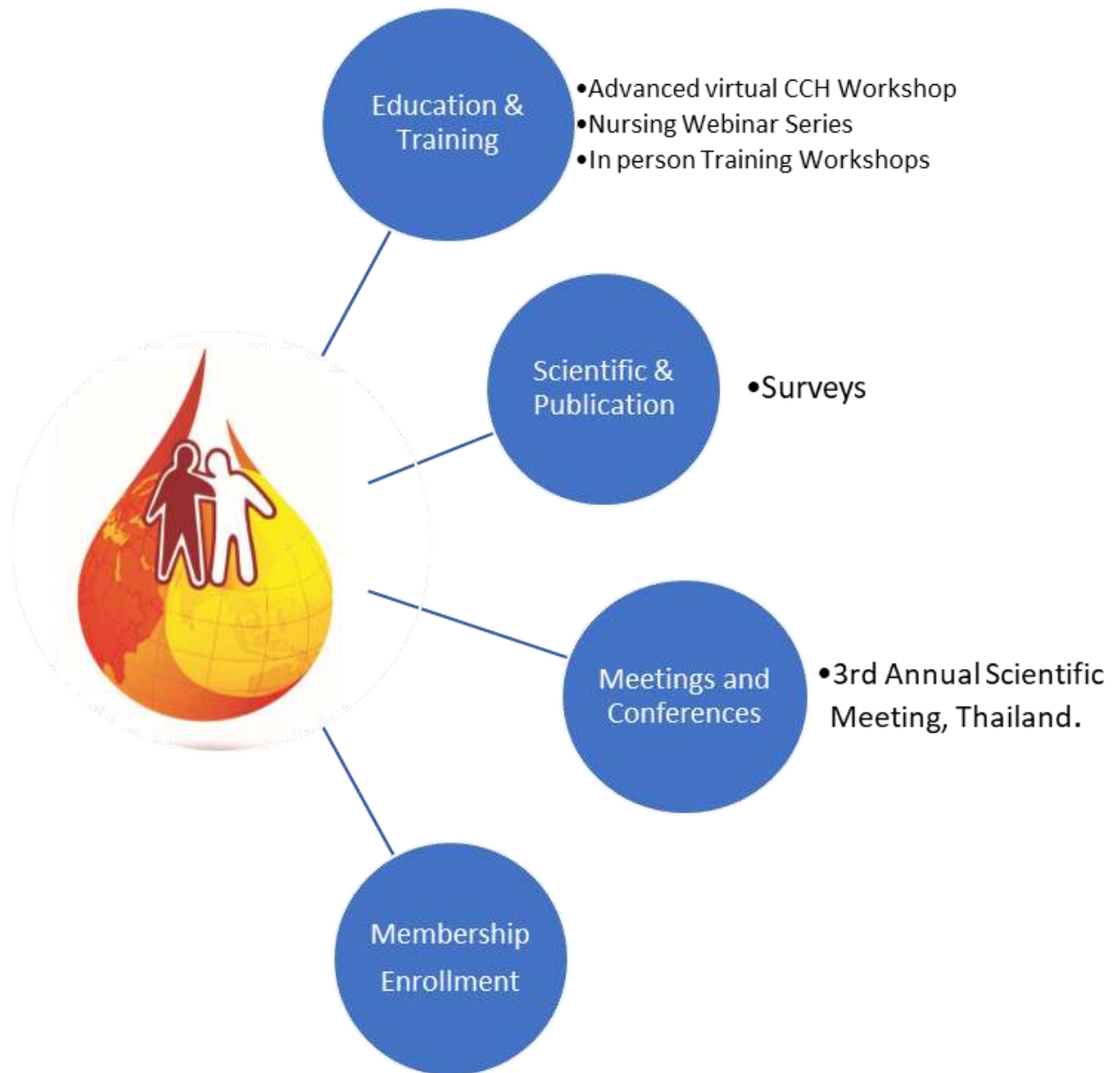
